

Title: Energy Storage Wind Power in Ireland

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How much wind energy does Ireland need?

In January 2025, wind farms generated 1,272 GWh, covering one-third of Ireland's electricity needs. Wind energy saved the country over EUR1.2 billion on gas imports in 2024. The government's target: 9 GW of onshore wind by 2030, alongside at least 5 GW of offshore wind.

Why is wind energy important to Ireland?

Wind energy is Ireland's greatest asset in responding to the climate emergency. Ireland will be energy independent. The decisions we make now will decide when. What does wind energy contribute to Ireland today? Price: Wind farms cut your electricity bills. When wind farms are producing electricity they push fossil fuel generation off the system.

Will Ireland need more energy storage?

With a target of 80% renewable electricity from intermittent sources on our grid by 2030, Ireland will require a significant amount of energy storage in the years to come.

When will long duration energy storage be available in Ireland?

The Irish Electricity Storage Policy Framework, published after this data was collected, indicates that an immediate route to market for 500 MW of long duration energy storage is currently being developed, with further studies planned to support long duration storage from 2030 to 2040 (Government Of Ireland 2024a).

What percentage of Ireland's Electricity comes from wind?

This figure would more than allow Ireland to meet its 2020 target to have 40% of electricity generated from renewable sources. Wind-generated electricity is variable however. On windy days, over half of Ireland's electricity comes from wind, while on other days it can be as low as 4%.
